

How Community Feedback Shaped the Design

Your input has directly guided key improvements to the Brown Road corridor. Here's how we incorporated what we heard:

Safer and More Comfortable Walking & Biking

• Separated walking and biking space: A shared-use path with visually distinct bike lanes and sidewalks, using different colored materials to create clear separation between people walking and biking.

Safe Crossings

- A raised crossing at SW Parkwood Lane to slow vehicle speeds and increase visibility.
- Pedestrian refuge medians and marked crosswalks at SW Camelot and SW Evergreen Drive for safer, calmer crossings at key locations.

Improved Transit Access & Safety

 Relocated bus stops based on community input, including moving the stop at SW Parkwood Lane to address sight-distance concerns for drivers turning onto Brown Road.

Better Lighting & Visibility

 New street lighting along the entire corridor to enhance visibility and safety for all users.

Tree Protection & Replanting

- Protecting significant trees wherever feasible.
- Working with Friends of Trees to plant new trees along the park frontage and offset necessary removals.

Speed Reduction

- Posted speed to be reduced to 25 mph.
- Intersection treatments including pedestrian refuge islands and raised crosswalks intended to reduce vehicle speeds.
