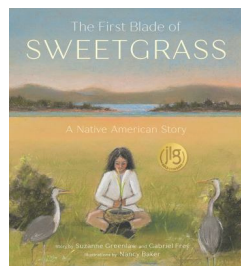


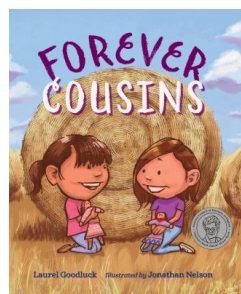

A sweet story of a young girl learning about the traditional way to pick sweetgrass and weave baskets with her grandmother.

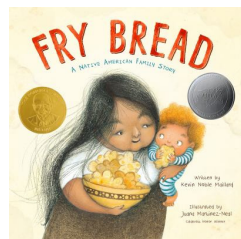

When two best friends and cousins are separated because of a move, only a special summer visit can assure them that they will always be best friends.

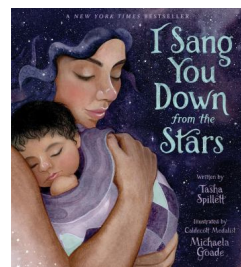

Children help a Native American grandmother make fry bread, delves into the history, social ways, foodways, and politics of America's 573 recognized Indian tribes.

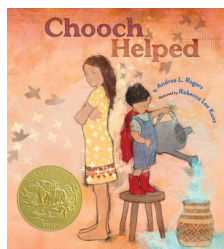

A mother sings and lovingly prepares for her baby, looking forward to the day her little one is born.

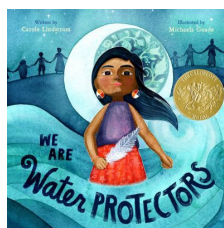

Chooch always wants to "help" even when his help makes things harder for his big sister. But family tenderness and patience prevails and there is a place for everyone.

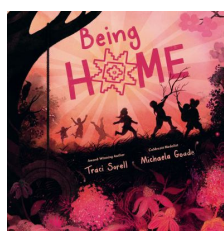

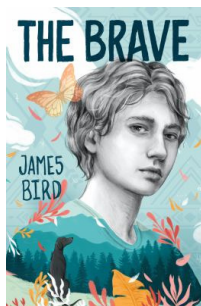
