
At West Linn Public Library in December

<u>Pink Pig Puppet Theatre</u> on Saturday, December 21st from 11:00-11:30am



Bear and Bird: the Cave by Jarvis




Froggy: A Pond Full of Pals by Paige Walshe

Jasper Rabbit from Creepy Carrots hosts a new chapter book series that's equal parts spooky and silly. In this one, Charlie wants to keep his tonsils after they're removed - but the tonsils have their own evil plans for Charlie...

A "rocky, icy, space-travelin" comet takes readers on a tour of the solar system. Fascinating facts, playful visuals, and plenty of jokes make this an engaging nonfiction title. especially for visual learners.

Learn about geese from a hungry fox and find out why a worm thinks the anaconda is awesome in these funny and (mostly) factual presentations, each given by a different animal.



Old School by Gordon Korman

Dexter has been home schooled by the elderly residents of a retirement home. Switching to middle school is a shock for him, and his new teachers and classmates also learn a lot. A fun chapter book with humor and heart.



The Millicent Quibb School of **Etiquette for Young Ladies** by Kate McKinnon

Three odd but clever sisters attend a school for mad scientists and battle a giant worm! Funny footnotes and silly science make this a perfect choice for fans of Dahl and Snicket.
