Big Bike, Little Bike by Kelly DuBay Gillis


When You Go to Dragon School by Chelsea M. Campbell


The Boy Who Lived in a Shell by John Himmelman

This short, illustrated story is about new neighbors, starting school, and making friends. The twist? One of the friends is a talking bulldozer! An imaginative and highly appealing choice for readers just starting out with chapter books.



A Gift of Dust by Martha Brockenbrough

This extraordinary blend of text and illustrations follows a dust speck through time and across the planet. Young readers will discover how even a tiny mote of dust can have a huge impact on life on earth.



Oasis by Guojing

With their mom missing, two kids try to survive in the desert in the not-toodistant future. Can a robot mother help them? This graphic novel is thought-provoking, suspenseful, and just a little bit out-of-the-ordinary.



The Peach Thief by Linda Joan Smith

When she gets caught stealing from a Lord's manor in 1850's England, Scilla must pose as a boy and work off her debt in the garden. Strong characters and an engaging plot make this a good choice for historical fiction fans.



Return to Sender by Vera Brosgol

Oliver is thrilled to discover that the mail slot in his new home can grant wishes, but using that power wisely turns out to be not that easy. An intriguing, fast-paced fantasy that also makes readers think.
