Gardeners who had a plot in 2025 will have first right of refusal for their plot in 2026. Current gardeners will receive an email to renew their current plot on January 2, 2026. They will have until February 1, 2026 to renew their plot either in person or online. Plots that are not renewed will go up for available registration, on a first come, first serve basis, for new gardeners on Tuesday, February 10.

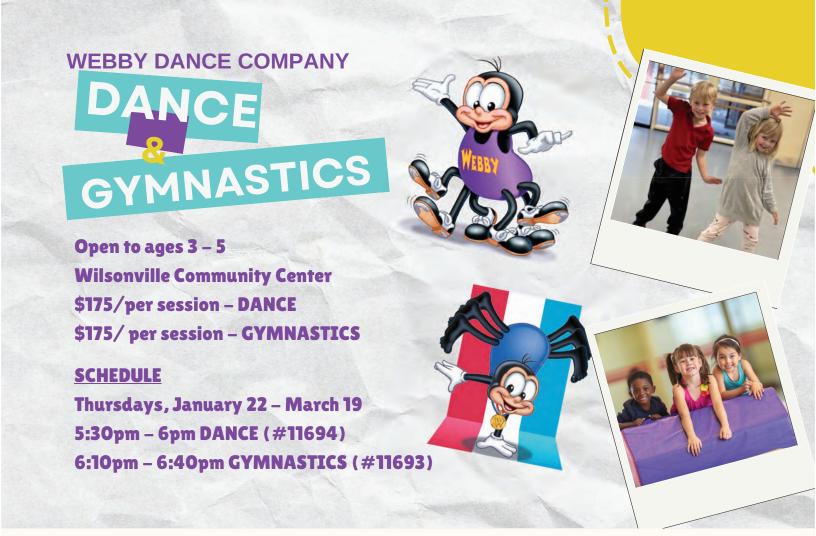

<u>2 HOUR CLASS - STAINED GLASS PLANT (\$85)</u> <u>FRI, FEB 6 FROM 5:30PM - 7:30PM</u> #11685

In this 2 hour class, you will make your own stained glass plant with pre-cut and ground leaves to create your own unique arrangement of leaves to capture and refract light. You will gain guided experience with soldering technique, learn how to frame with lead came, how to solder tinned copper wire, and how to clean and polish stained glass.
